HEAD LICE PROOF OF TREATMENT CHECKLIST

Your child has a case of head lice. Items in your home and other members of your household may also be infested with head lice. In order to get rid of this problem and to prevent your child from getting head lice again from infested items or persons in your home, please complete the following checklist. Return this completed checklist with your child upon readmission to school.

1.	Did all infested household members, including your child have treatment with a special shampoo for killing head lice? (Did you follow directions for use of the shampoo?)		
2.	Did all household members found to have lice have their hair combed with a fine-toothed comb following the special shampoo treatments? (This helps to remove lice eggs called nits.)		
3.	Did all household members put on clean, laundered clothes immediately after the shampoo treatment?		
4.	 Were all clothes which had been worn prior to the shampoo treatment cleaned by being: a. laundered in hot, soapy water (130 degrees) and dried in a very hot dryer; or b. dry cleaned; or c. sealed in an airtight plastic bag for a minimum of 2 weeks? 		
5.	Were bath towels and washcloths, which were used before or during shampoo treatment, thoroughly washed using detergent, hot water and dried in a hot dryer?		
6.	 Was the bedding (used before treatment shampoo) including pillows, pillowcases, sheets, blankets, bedspreads, and stuffed animals cleaned in one of the following manners: a. hot, soapy water and dried in a hot dryer; or b. dry cleaned; or c. sealed in an airtight plastic bag for a minimum of 2 weeks? 		
7.	 Were hats, headgear and coats which were worn before treatment, cleaned by being: a. washed in hot, soapy water and dried in a hot dryer; or b. dry cleaned; or c. sealed in an airtight plastic bag for a minimum of 2 weeks?

8.	 Were all hair brushes, combs and wigs cleaned using: a. hot, soapy water, and soaked in Lysol solution for at least 20 minutes; or b. sealed in an airtight plastic bag for a minimum of 2 weeks? 		
9.	Has the entire house been thoroughly vacuumed including: a. fabric covered furniture b. removable cushions c. pillows d. mattresses e. carpeting f. car upholstery?		
10.	Does everyone in your household understand not to share clothing, hair combs, bands, brushes and hair accessories?		
11.	Do you plan to conduct a second treatment in $7 - 10$ days for all persons treated for head lice? (This is to make sure that any lice that may have hatched will be treated.)		
12.	Do you have a plan for daily inspection at home of all family members for at least $2 - 3$ weeks?		

If you've checked "yes" to all questions above, you have done your part to control the spread of head lice in your home.
