A: Allergies & Arrival/Dismissal Procedures

Allergies: Please be sensitive to classmates' allergies. As I learn of allergies, I will share any pertinent information with classmates' families.

Arrival: anytime between window of 8:00 - 8:30 a.m.

- Enter from south gate off Ridge Avenue.
- Follow traffic pattern to drop off your child. You may walk your child into the PK entrance (west entrance) (2D) of the Parish Center.
- Park in Ridge Street parking lot. Please cross at the crosswalk to the PK entrance (west entrance) (2D).
- If you arrive after 8:20 a.m., please ring the doorbell at PK entrance (west entrance) (2D) of the Parish Center.
- Exit from the north gate onto Ridge Avenue.

Dismissal: 11:00 a.m.

- Enter the Walnut Street Parking Lot. Follow (counterclockwise) traffic pattern.
- Pick up from preschool entrance (west entrance) of Parish Center.
- Do not park in Ridge Avenue parking lot between 8: 30 2:45.
 - Please be mindful that this is a school campus. Please drive slowly, and do not use cell phones while driving in the parking lot. Also, when dropping off and picking up your child, please be aware of your child and siblings in the parking lot. Safety is very important.
 - Please send a note in your child's take-home folder or email me if your child is going home with someone else.
 - Please copy and paste to share this information with anyone else who will be dropping off/picking up from preschool.

B: Backpacks & Balanced Literacy & Birthdays & Buddies

Backpacks: Please bring a regular sized backpack that can fit art projects that will come home and a Ziploc bag with an extra set of clothing including socks.

Balanced Literacy: As part of a cohort of schools that grew professionally while implenting Balanced Literacy as part of Roosevelt University's Illinois 5-Year Teacher Quality Grant (2011-2016), Our Lady of the Wayside School has school-wide literacy teams, and teachers use differentiated instruction.

Birthdays: We would love to celebrate your child's birthday at school. If you are available, we will arrange a time for you to read to the class. This is usually at 8:30, but can be rearranged to fit your schedule. Please see the birthday schedule. Contact me if the day/time listed needs to be rearranged. Please do not send in birthday treats or trinkets. If you would like, you may donate a book to the class library to share with the class, but it is not necessary. If you are sending any birthday invitations through backpack mail, they may be sent only if invitations to the entire class are given in order to be considerate of the feelings of others.

Buddies: One of the unique aspects of attending Our Lady of the Wayside, a PK - 8th grade school, is participating in the Buddies Program. Students from different grade levels are paired together. Older students serve as role models to younger children. Students get together with their buddies to read together, attend Mass together and participate in additional activities throughout the year.

J: Jolly Phonics & Journals

Jolly Phonics: The PK-3 Program offers exposure to letter recognition and letter sounds through <u>The Jolly Phonics Program</u>.

School Journals: Students will have opportunities throughout the year to journal, an important pre-writing skill, which helps to capture memorable moments in young children's lives. Children will draw and adults will take children's dictations to tell about the pictures. Journal entries will be saved and taken home in student portfolios/memory books at the end of the year. Journal entries can be seen at conferences. If you would like to see journal entries anytime during the year, feel free to come in at drop-off or pick-up and take a peek at Memory Books which are kept in our Writing Area.

Home Writing Journals: Encourage your child to draw a picture. Ask them to tell you about what they drew. Write down what your child tells you. Send it to school, and I will write a message back to your child.

K: Kid-Centered (Child-Centered)

Kid-Centered (Child-Centered): This learning approach encourages children to explore, learn, take risks and learn from people around them.
